

Signature which had Reference to the said Commission
 under the Signet of Scotland was shewnd upon many
 occasions by saying that the said Commission warranted
 the Plantation in the Isles of Kent which (as now appears)
 it did not when you was also upon consideration of a former
 Order of that Board of the third of July 10.33 wherein it ap-
 peared that the Differences now in question being then con-
 sidered the said Baltimore mistook to the right of his Patent
 and the Plantations to the Crown of said then Lordships be-
 longed to and declared as above said the Right and Title
 to the Isles of Kent and other places in question to be wholly
 Belonging to the said Baltimore and that no Plantation or
 Trade with the Indians ought to be within the Limits of his
 Patent without License from him did therefore likewise
 think fit and declare that no Grant from his Majesty should
 give to the said Captain or any others of the said Isles of Kent
 or any other parts or places within the said Patent whereof
 his Majesty's Attorney General, Solicitor General are hereby purposed
 to take Notice and concerning the Violence and Wrongs by the
 said Captain and the rest Complain'd of in the said Petition
 to his Majesty then Lordships did now also declare that they
 found no Cause at all to Relieve them but do leave both sides
 thereunto the Ordinary Course of Justice
