Commission to Robt. Philpot &c

Whereas Lord Populet &c doth hereby Robert Philpot William le Ward Thomas Merton of the Isle of Jersey giving whereunto willing to provide for the Government of the said Island therfore responges special trust in your Judgment and discretion we do hereby Authorise and institute and appoint you thence and everyone of you by himself to be Governor of the place within the said Island to use and execute all the same powers and Authorities whatsoever

within
