persons as you shall find so unlawfully trading with  
our License from us or our Lieutenant General and if such  
persons shall refuse to obey you or either of you in the exe-  
cution of this our Commission we do further Authorise  
you or either of you to use all necessary force and means  
for the compelling them to obey hereunto as you shall  
find it to be needful so that you or either of you have  
their said persons vessels and Goods before us or our Lieu-  
t General at Saint Marys as soon as conveniently

Answer for their Contempt committed  
against Our Ordinance and  
in that behalf and for satisfying this shall be your Com-  
mission given at S<sup>t</sup> Marys this 11<sup>th</sup> March 1638 witness
