The Governor Authorised the Secretary to Administer  
an Oath to him for the equal Administration of Justice &c<sup>s</sup>

Then were Sworn Captain Thomas Cornwaleys Esq  
Mr Giles Brent Gent Mr John Seuger Gent in the form  
appointed for a Councillor to take upon the same bill

Then was Sworn the said John Seuger in the Oath  
Appointed for the Secretary

Then was chosen and Sworn for Sheriff and Coro-  
ner Thomas Bulbridge for 1 Year

Then was chosen for Treasurer of the Province Mr  
Giles Brent

Then the Governor Authorised the Secretary to  
Administer to them the Oath of Allegiance as it is Recorded  
in the Bill of the last Assembly intituled an act for  
Swearing Allegiance

Then the Governor administered the same Oath  
to all the Council

April 13<sup>th</sup>

A Commission to Thomas Boys to arrest any persons  
Vessels or Goods unlawfully trading with the Indians  
by Land or water

25<sup>th</sup> April 1639

Then are to will and Require you to draw  
a Commission to Captain Thomas Cornwaleys Esq<sup>r</sup> &c<sup>s</sup>  
for the hearing and determining of any Civil Causes hap-  
ping during my Absence from Saint Marys in the same
