

We Willms &c<sup>s</sup> to all persons &c<sup>s</sup> Know ye that we  
 have Granted unto the Beere here of Andrew Chappell  
 full License and Authority to trade with any Indians of  
 our Province of Maryland for Comand the Corn so tra-  
 ded for to export out of our said Province and to trade the  
 same with any people inhabiting to the Northward of the  
 Capes commonly called Cape Henry and Cape Charles willing  
 and Requiring all such Seamen and others as shall Accom-  
 pany the said Andrew in his said Voyage to be Obedient  
 ..... to him in all his lawfull Commands and we  
 do strictly prohibit the said Andrew or any other accompa-  
 :nying him to Export any arms or Ammunition to any  
 Indian or Foreigner whatsoever upon pain of such se-  
 :vere punishment as such a Crime shall deserve and we  
 will that this our Commission continue in force until the  
 next Return of the said Andrew or his Vessel into our said  
 Province of Maryland Witness Leonard Calvert Esq<sup>r</sup> Ad-  
 miral of our said Province Given at Saint Marys this  
 11<sup>th</sup> June 1639

Leonard Calvert Esq<sup>r</sup> &c<sup>s</sup> to Nicholas Harvey  
 Greeting whereas Certain Indians of the Nation called  
 the Miananteyants have committed sundry insolencies &  
 Rapines upon the English inhabiting within this Part  
 and being thereof demanded Satisfaction heretofore have  
 Refused to make any and therefore Compelled us to en-  
 force them thereto by the Justice of a war these are there-  
 fore to allowe you with any Company of English as  
 shall be willing to go along with you they exceed the num-  
 ber of twelve men sufficiently provided with arms to invade  
 the said Miananteyants only and against them and there  
 Lands and Goods to execute and inflict what may be  
 inflicted by the Law of War and the pillage & Booty therein
