 Saint Clements Isle Greeting whereas the said St Clements
 Isle and that part of the Main over against it which
 lieth between the Steung Creek and Saint Sathurines Creek is
 thought fit to be erected into a hundred by the Name of St
 Clements hundred we willing to provide for the better Conser-
 vation of the peace and of good Order within the said hun-
 dred do hereby authorize you to be high Constable of the said
 hundred with all powers to a high Constable Belonging
 by the law or usage of England and in special to arrest all
 Offenders against the peace and them to send or bring woun
 Lieutenant General or some Justice of that division having
 Authority to hear and punish such Offenders and to enquire
 of and present to our Lieut General or other Justice aforesaid
 all persons whatsoever that shall unlawfully trespass upon
 any our Game of Deer Turkeys herons or other wild fowl
 or shall destroy them their nests or Eggs either upon our Land
 or waters without leave of us or under &c^s and to take away
 their nets Hounds or other means of taking them or that shall
 sell or without License deliver any arms or ammunition to
 any Indian or that shall not have ready upon all Occasions
 sufficient arms and Ammunition within his house as the
 Law requireth for defence against the Indians and to make
 Searches and use all means necessary for the execution of
 the power hereby committed unto you Saint Marys 16th
 March 1639.

Cecilius &c^s your trusty Thomas Gerard Gent whereas
 we have thought fit to erect the Isles commonly Called Saint
 Clements Isle and Steuns Isle and all the Land over against
 the said Islands on the north Bank of Stowmack River be-
 tween the Creek commonly called the Steung Creek on the East
