 sengers to be and we will that this our Commission con-  
 tinue in force during Pleasure of us or our Lieutenant  
 General Given 5<sup>th</sup> May 1640

Excelsis &c<sup>o</sup> to our trusty Henry Bishop Greeting we  
 do hereby Authorise and withal will and Require you  
 to attach any person or persons unlawfully trading  
 with any Indians of this Province for Beaver Furs or  
 any other Commodities and such person or persons to  
 have at Saint Marys there to answer for Contempt of the  
 Proclamation made and published in that behalf and  
 if such person or persons cannot be attached then to attach  
 any such other Goods whatsoever of or belonging to  
 such person or persons so unlawfully trading and the  
 same to keep in safe Custody until such person or persons  
 shall put in security to answer such Contempts and  
 misdemeanors as shall be Objected in that behalf against  
 him or them at Saint Marys and forthwith upon your  
 Return to Saint Marys to deliver such such Goods so  
 Attached to our Receiver General or our Sheriff of Saint  
 Marys and for so doing this shall be your warrant  
 Given July 13<sup>th</sup>
