Cecilus &c^d to our faithful and Beloved Councillor Giles Brent Gent Greeting whereas many causes may happen within the Isle of Kent wherein our Commander of the said Island is a party or that is or may be interested which cannot be called or Removed to Saint Marys without Great Charge trouble and hinderance both to our said Commander and to any other parties we reposing Especial trust and Confidence in your Judgment and Integrity do hereby assign and Authorise you to hear and determine all civil Actions whatsoever arising within the said Island wherein our said Commander is party Plaintiff or Defendant or otherwise or wherein the party Plaintiff or Defendant is entitled by from or under our said Commander from and to use and Exercise all power and means necessary to such Judicature & to the execution of it except appeal be made from your Sentence in which case you may bind the party appeal^r in such Sum and with such Sureties as you shall think fit to prosecute the appeal before our Lieutenant General within a certain time by you to be Limited Reasonably and to perform the Judgment of the Court Given at Saint Marys under our Great Seal this 8th May 1641 Witness our Dear Brother &c^d
