Proclamation

Proclamation by Lieutenant General to prohibit the Inhabitants
 of Saint Marys upon paine to forfeit or lose the Liberty
 to kill any Swine at all in the woods (other then his own
 Swine upon his own land) without license first had under
 the hand of Lieutenant General which shall not be denied
 to any owners of mine in the woods as shall be ready to give
 such Recognisance for keeping good Order in the said Liberty
 as shall be thought fit to that end
