Proclamation touching Indians

By the Lieutenant General

Whereas I by a late proclamation dated the 17th of this instant made the English were authorised to kill any Indians in any the plantations Patuxent River that should be met with upon the land or water on this side the neck between the Back River of Patuxent and the main road towards Nicholas Harveyes with certain exceptions therewer mentioned now I do hereby upon some Reasons and Accidents since happening utterly repeal and Reverse the said proclamation and straitly prohibit upon pain of death that no English within the County of Saint Marys or any other part of the Province do kill or shoot any Indian whatsoever further such as he shall know to be Susquehanawes or Wicomes unless first assaulted or put in Bodily fear of his life by the Indian and whereas by one other proclamation dated the 13th September last the Nanticoke Indians were declared to be Enemies of the Province I revoke likewise hereby the said declaration and do publish and declare that there is a treaty of peace betwixt me and them and a truce of 6 weeks agreed upon for the finishing the Treaty and hereupon have taken them into his lordships protection for the time afores but for the better securing..... of all the English Inhabitants of the Province from all harm that may happen to them through the Treachery and Falshood of any Indians I do forbid all the said English to entertain or harbour in their houses any Indian whatsoever without special license or appointment from me and upon any Indians Refusal to depart upon necessary demand given to expell them by violence but not to the killing them unless they shall assault the life of the English given at Saint Marys this 26 Jan 1642.
