 Arms what Guns fixed or unfixed what Swords or other
 Weapons what quantity of powder and Shot and of
 what sort of Shot and to take the deposition of every
 One in Writing with his or her hand or mark thereunto
 and to Return all such depositions unto me or W. Scory
 without any delay and this do forthwith after the
 receipt hereof and hereof not to fail by the duty you owe
 to the Commands of me your Lieutenant General and
 upon pain of Contempt
