

Proclamation against Indians
By the Lieutenant General

Whereas I am informed by a great complaint of
divers of the Great number of guns now in the hands &
use of the Indians in and about this Colony which is a
disorder tending to very ill Consequence if it be not in time
restrained and Reduced to some good Order I do therefore
by the Lord Proprietors name strictly prohibit all per-
sons within this Colony of Saint Marys to lend or deliver
upon any pretence whatsoever Gun powder or shot
to any Indian without a License first had and Obtained
from me to that purpose upon pain of such fine and
other Lensure according to the quality of the persons as the
Contempt shall deserve and I do hereby require the Sheriff
of Saint Marys to name 12 freemen of this County to
be at the Collet in the first of February next to enquire of
and present the names of all such as they shall know or
hear of to offend against this Prohibition Given at Saint
Marys this 2 January 1643

Proclamation export Tob
By the Lieutenant General

Whereas by reason of the unseasonableness of this
last past year small quantities of Tobacco have been
made within this Colony whereby the Shippes bound hither
or out of England for supply of the Colony are like to want
of their home Freight for provision for their Benefit
in that part in as far as the Tobaccos of this Colonies
growth will amount I have thought fit and do hereby
prohibit all export of Tobacco out of this Province
after the publication hereof in the several Counties Res-
pectively by or upon any other Vessel or Vessels whatsoe-
ver other then shippes or ships coming from England
