Whereas I am certainly informid that Corn this present year is very much feared to be wanting to supply the Inhabitants of this Province and that there is no great likelihood of any considerable supply thereof to come in from abroad but must wholly depend upon it self and that the export of any such Corn is most prejudicial to the Inhabitants thereof these are therefore straitly to prohibit and forbid any persons or persons whatsoever to carry or transport any Corn of the Province without leave first Obtained from myself upon the pain of such ^{were} Censure as the Provincial Court shall adjudge such Offendor to deserve and likewise for the benefit and preservation of the increase of the stock of Horses now within the Province much to the advantage of his Lordships Colony and the safety of ^{the Inhabitants of} the Province they being so useful both in peace and war and that said stock being as yet very small I do hereby straitly prohibit and forbid any horses mares or Foales to be transported out of the Province by any person or persons whatsoever until his Lordships pleasure be further known therein upon pain of such severe punishment
