

by virtue of his Lordships Conditions of plantation
the said rights usually belonged to the Lords of Mannors
in England and that the words in the patent expressed
in all Commodities Advantages Emoluments and Re-
vintments whatsoever / Royal Jurisdiction excepted
included the same

December 9th 1648

This day came Captain Robert Vaughan and hum-
bly petitioned the Governor to withdraw his Action ag-
ainst him and acknowledged before the said Governour and
other planters present to have divers times Reviled the
said Governour with Scandalous and upbraiding speeches
upon the Isle of Kent where he bore the Command as
also to have sundry times in his discourse upon the said
Isle taxed the said Governour with partiality of Justice
which said fact he confessed to be foul and Rashly
done by him and altogether false and withal humbly
Required forgiveness for such his said misdemeanors
herein expressing sorrow therefore with purpose of Amend-
ment and desired that he may not be brought to be
Censured as such his facts in this kind deserve

Whereupon the Governour withdrew his Action
and pardoned the Offence,

Whereas a proclamation was sent up to the Inha-
bitants ^{of the Isle of Kent} bearing date at Saint Marys 11 November) to sus-
pend and revoke all power and Authority of Command
upon the said Isle of Kent from Captain Robert Vaughan
^{Commander of the said Island}
wherein also the Inhabitants upon the said Isle were
acquitted and discharged from their Obedience due unto
