

it was on the behalf of the right Honble the Lord Sec-  
 retary of this Province and by his direction declared  
 that it was his Lordships will and pleasure that all such  
 persons in the said proclamation mentioned that pre-  
 tended any right to any Lands which have been due unto  
 them or any of them within this Province by virtue of  
 any Conditions of Plantation or any other manner under  
 his Lordships hand and Seal at any time before the 7<sup>th</sup>  
 of March 1648 for which no Grants under his Lordships  
 Great Seal have been passed unto them should by the terms  
 limited in the said several Proclamations come and make  
 their rights appear unto his Lordships Lieutenant of this  
 Province or to such deputy as he should ordain and ap-  
 point in case of his absence or death for the Government  
 of this Province under his Lordships which they presented  
 to any such Lands and after survey thereof and before  
 the time limited demand Grants for the same under his  
 Lordships new Great Seal of this Province and thereupon  
 they should have Grants speedily passed to them according  
 to Justice as by the said proclamations remaining upon  
 Record with the Secretary of this Province more at large  
 amongst other things it doth and may appear now for  
 that I am informed divers persons both here and in Virginia  
 and elsewhere who have Lands due to them by virtue of  
 former Conditions upon pretence of not having notice of the  
 said former proclamations have not yet taken up the same  
 to the end therefore that no man may for the future justly  
 pretend ignorance or other excuse for their neglect herein  
 I have again thought fit and do hereby declare that all &  
 every person and persons who have yet any Land due  
 to them or any of them by virtue of any former Conditions
