

of Hunting here in Saint Marys and Charles County
 not only to the utter destroying of the Game and disturbance
 of the Hops and Cattle if not destroying of them also but
 by their insolencies not to be endured here like to bring great
 Troubles to the Inhabitants of this Province if not timely
 Prevented these are therefore in the names of the Keepers
 of the Liberties of the Commonwealth of England by Autho-
 rity of Parliament strictly to prohibit every Inhabitant
 of this Province to give any of the said Indians here
 any entertainment or to have any Trade or Commerce
 with them in this Province in any kind whatsoever
 after the time here expressed excepting any Indian Con-
 taining Youth in the penal Summe of forfeiture of five
 hundred pounds of Tobacco for every such Offence aforesaid
 the One half to the use of the Lord Proprietary his heirs &
 the other part to the Informer and that they give unto the
 said Indians in case that they come here contrary to this
 Proclamation fair warning to be gone which if they refuse
 so to do Captain John Price be forthwith acquainted who
 is hereby Required to levy Soldiers and do his endeavour
 to drive them out of the Province this be proclaimed by Mr
 Sand at his house and set up at his door the 11 day of
 this month and to be in force the twenty sixth day following
 Given under my hand at Saint Marys this 9th August.
