 shewance for any adventurer or planter to be granted upon his
 Lordships condition of plantation without some warrant
 from myself or authority from me or other special warrant
 or direction from his said Lordship here published for his so
 doing; his the said Surveyors former irregular and unmanni-
 tal proceedings herein having occasioned much troubles and
 inconvenience to the great abuse both of his Lordships Authority
 and the Inhabitants and thereof you the said Captain Robert
 Vaughan W^m Lloyd and W^m Robert Clark his Lordships Land
 Surveyor Generall are required to take due notice and comply in all
 things with the directions herein before given you and every
 of you respectively as you will answer the contrary Given at St^e
 Marys this 18th day of December Anno Domini 1632

Forasmuch as I am given to understand that there
 is like to be some scarcity of Corn in the Province this present Year
 and that divers persons have and do take Liberty to buy Corn
 of the Indians inhabiting within this Province and to trans-
 port the same out of the Province into other parts to prevent
 the like for the future these are in the names of the Kings of the
 Liberties of England & Authority of Parliament to will Require
 and command all and every the Inhabitants of this Province
 Foreigners and others whom it may concern that they nor
 any of them do or shall not presume to transport any Corn
 out of this Province which they or any of them shall buy of
 any Indian inhabiting within this Province without special
 License from me for so doing all which was read or further
