These are in his Lordships name to witness &
appear Captain Robert Brighton Esquire
of the Isle of Wight in the said Province of
Maryland to grant warrants for land within the said
County to any of his planters according to
his Lordships condition of plantation whereby no
such land shall happen to be due to such planters
or planters respectively by the said Captain Robert
Brighton among the said planters together with the
particular demands and payments upon which the
same shall be granted to be entered upon record by his
Lordships Surveyor of the said Province who is to
have his usual fees for such warrants and entries
Given at Providence in Anne Arundel County this 29th
of July anno Domini 1650

Decretus ad to the Admi
nistratrix of Smithfields Estate

Be it known unto all the inhabitants and people within
the said Province of Maryland and to all others whom
these presents shall concern Greeting Whereas at a Court
held at Saint Marys within our said Province the 20th
day of June instant upon the motion of Walter Beane
and Walter Tuke who by order of the 20th of December
1648 had been admitted to the administration of the
Estate of William Smithfield deceased and upon pro-
ducing their accounts upon oath formerly taken whereby
it appears that they had fully administered and no
thing being objected to the contrary albeit publick
