entraide with the Indians ought to be within the precincts  
of his Patent without license from him in and by the  
Orders of their Lordships nowe at large yearly these are  
therefore for the future preventing of further mischief &  
Injuries which may arise from ignorant mistakes or  
Presumptions and Practices as formerly in his Majesty's  
summons to prohibit all persons baning inhabiting or intaking  
shall hereafter bear and inhabit within the Government  
of this Colony by themselves or others either directly or in-  
directly from the date of these presents to use exercise or en-  
tertain any trade or commerce for any kind of Commo-  
dity whatsoever with any of the Indians or Salvages  
Inhabiting within the said Province of Maryland viz  
Northward from the River Wicomico commonly known  
by the name of Anancock on the Eastern side of the Grand  
Bay of Chesapeake and Northward from the River Chinc-  
quack called great Wicomico on the Western side of the  
said Bay and for the better regulating of all Trades within  
the said Colony it is further hereby Commanded that no  
Persons shall resort unto the habitations of the aforesaid In-  
dians without license first obtained for their so doing from  
the Lord Baltimore or his Substitute upon [redacted] care of the  
Goods and Vessels or the full Value of them which shall be  
lawfully agreed to be traded or employed contrary to the  
Premises with such further punishment by imprisonment  
& meareing of the said proclamation as shall be thought  
fit by the Governor and Council given at James City the  
4 of October anno Regni Regis Caroli Secundo anno  
Domini 1638
