The Declaration of
 John Leuzer for the
 Lord Proprietor of
 Henry Fleete.

John Leuzer on the behalf of the Lord Proprietor doth complain
 against Captain Henry Fleete of s^t. Georges hundred planter, for
 that whereas the said Lord Proprietor together with divers other gentlemen
 were joint adventurers in the trade of beaver with the Indians of the Province
 wherein the said Lord Proprietor was interested in one moiety of the said trade,
 the said Henry Fleete in another moiety; and that the said Henry Fleete
 did on ~~the~~ ^{the} said day in the year one thousand six hundred twenty four
 borrow of the said adventurers out of the common stock by the care of their
 factor Iupinian Snow planter, one hundred weight of beaver furs,
 and that the said Henry Fleete did in consideration thereof upon and to one
 assignee and promise unto the said adventurers that the said Henry Fleete
 out of the parts in the next returns of beaver to the said common stock would
 well and faithfully repay the said hundred weight of beaver; Robert
 Calvert the said Henry Fleete not regarding his said promise and assumption
 but intending fraudulently to deceive the said Lord Proprietor of the said
 moiety in the said hundred weight of beaver, the said moiety unto the said
 Lord Proprietor according to his said promise and assumption hath not yet
 paid, although he hath been often requested to pay the same by the whole
 Leonard Calvert Esq, Lieutenant. general of the Province on the behalf of
 the said Lord Proprietor, and hath had return of the said trade for the said
 assumption to the full quantity of the said hundred weight of beaver; but hath
 refused, and still doth refuse to pay the same to the damage of the said Lord
 Proprietor of one hundred weight of beaver. And for the said John
 Leuzer, attorney for the said Lord Proprietor doth bring the said
 Petition proffered of Court against the said Henry Fleete. John Leuzer

warrant against Henry Fleete as the father of John Leuzer in an action of debt of 100.00.
