Marias hundred, varjente and ^{Regent} ~~General~~ ^{Regent} of the same hundred shanters, for that whereas the said Thomas Pasmore and Regent May did assume and oblige themselves to pay unto John Moale of Anson in Virginia indent or unto his assignee the summe of three hundred and seventy two pound of good tobacco on the twenty day of November last past; and that the said John Moale did assigne over the said summe of tobacco unto the ylt. Thomas Cornwallis; notwithstanding the said Thomas Pasmore and Regent May not regarding their said assumption and obligation, the said summe of ^{three} hundred and seventy two pound of tobacco unto the said John Moale, or his assignee Thomas Cornwallis hath not yett paid, but hath refused, and still doth refuse to pay the same, to the damage of the said Thomas Cornwallis of two hundred weight of tobacco. And for that he doth bring his suite, and prayeth process agt. the said Thomas Pasmore and Regent May.
