

And if two or more stand up to speak together, the Lieutenant shall call off the roll
by name.

From no man shall stand up to speak to any matter until the parties are called up before,
called down, nor shall any one speak above one to one bill or matter at one reading
nor shall refuse the force of any order, nor any writ or contentious law, nor shall name
him but by some circumlocution. And if any one offend to the contrary, the Lieutenant shall
call command him to silence.

From the court shall sit every day at eight of the clock in the morning, and at two of
the clock in the afternoon.

From the freedom assembled at any time to any number above ten persons, at the
court aforesaid, or within one court after, shall be a court to all intents.

From every one proposing any matter to the court shall sign it first into writing,
and deliver it to the Secretary to be read unto the court.

And it was ordered by the court that the Court could be kept up
in some public place of the court, to the end all men might take notice of
the same.

And of the second day, being 26th January.
