privately.

From no man shall persons so speak to any matter which is to be done by ye Assembly
either said down, nor shall any one speak above out to one self or another at one meeting
nor shall report ye facts of any other wise, any verifiable or contentious tumult, nor, shall any
give out by, but circumlocution. And if any out offend in ye contrary, ye Lieutenant shall
call command him to silence.

From ye people shall sit every day at eight of ye clock in ye morning, and at two of
ye clock in ye afternoon.

From ye freemen assembled at any time to any number above ten persons, at 12th
youth aforesaid, or within one hour after, shall a goode all present be.

From whom ever prosecuting any matter to ye people shall digest it first into writing
and delibe it to ye Secretary to be read unto ye people.

And it was ordered by ye people that ye Clerk should be set up
in some publick place of ye people, to ye end all men might take notice of
him.
