And because the Court was to be held in the interim time, that is to say, on the 3rd of February, that whereas the privilege of parliament should be void while the Court were past; that all freemen might be accepted as if no assembly were.

Wee have having special trust & confidence in your ability and experience, have nominated and appointed, and doe hereby nominate, appoint, and appoint you to be Sheriff of the County of St. Martin until we shall signify our pleasure to the contrary, giving you hereby full power and authority lawfully to do all and every thing and things which unto you office of a Sheriff of any County in England doe or may belong. Given at St. Martin the 25th January 1637. Witness Leonard Calvert Lieutenant Governour.
