Richard Craven and Robert Clarke exhibited it proper for him.
Marmedale Snow and Euphian Snow exhibited it proper for him.
Edmond Parry answered.
Richard suggested, desired to revoke it proper, and was admitted.

The Committee reported to the house that they thought fit to read the former
draft of laws against, & to put them to the vote the second time, in regard where
was found a great deal of misunderstanding of them among the members, w^{ch} made
them to revise them.

And it being put to the vote of the house whether they should be read again or no
it was affirmed by 40. yeas, and denied by 21. yeas.

Then was an order made of general consent of the house that all bills
proposed to the house for laws, should be read 3. times on 3. several days
before they should be put to the vote.

When were the draft of laws read proposed the second time. And hereby
bills proposed by the Committee were read the first time.
Capt. Cornwall desired it might be put to the vote of the house, whether they
should at the first reading should be voted severally, or the whole body of them
together. And that they should be voted altogether was affirmed by 47. yeas,
denied by 37.
