Charles Lord Proprietary to George Esq; Sec of State greeting. We command
you that you attayn yr Bodys of Richard Thompson, Ioseph Abbott, and Samuell
Smith of your fflant, and that you keepe them in safe custodie, until you & all
yall sufficient ffority to answer to the suit of william Cloberry wdig. and
company in an action of debt of him yound wdig of labours; what is now y^e
said Richard Thompson in an action of þre yound wdig, and he said John
Abbott in an action of 3000 t. and he said Samuell Smith in an action of þre
yound wdig; at the next Court to be held at 8th. march in þe first of may
wdig; and to abide y^e judgment of þe Court. Given at 5th. march y^e

Charles Lord Proprietary of þe Province of maryland and Roanoke, Lord 28 March
of 1637 where he to alayng to yee George Esq; Sec of State greeting. Chuse youly
wt for divers good considerations of þeire meeting, þat þe same be granted and by þis
þis þe 28th instant in þe County of St. Marys made, þe same þe 28th instant
þowre liberty livers and authority to gather & wanþþ þe þe same þe 28th instant
of our Province of maryland, and þe same our parts þereof to trade þe same
for oþer þabber or any oþer commodity with þe Indians in þe same with or
with any Indian or other þe people whiche þe same or inhabiting to þe northward
without þe Cayes commonly called Cape Henne and Cape Charles, nothing and requiring
all þat as þat among þe þe said voyage to be obedient to þe in all þe
Cawfille commands, and also so illing & requiring þe said þe said Thomas not to þe
order or oþer þe yest or lend any armes powder or ammunition unto any
Indian or foreigner whiche þe same of þe above required: as þat a written
rate reporte þat we will þe same our Commission continue in þe same þe same
and whiche were during þe same þe same. Given at our þost of 5th. march y^e
