the said work; if it shall be exchanged for better, or some wigwee linen.

12. Feb. 1637.

This day came before me James Pasmore and  
Robert Smith, and acknowledged themselves, and say one for himselfe  
to owe unto the said Thomas Copley Esq; and one of the Council of the  
Province two thousand four hundred weight of tobacco; tobacco unto the  
said Thomas Copley Esq; the first of January, admiralors or assignes  
on the 10. of November next. And if they shall not so do, they will  
and grant for themselves their joint and several admiralors, yet the said  
bond of two thousand four hundred weight of tobacco is to be paid upon their  
goods & chattells wheresoever they shall be found.
