

By G. Coborne and Comstle 15. 2. 1637.

The Gob^t and Comstle taking into consideration ye many grievances impos'd
vpon us by the inhabitants of ye govt of N. P. Province for which committed
by divers of ye inhabitan's of ye C. of Kent, and by ye warrant sent
lately into yo' said C. under ye great seal of ye province for excommunication
of true malefactors and for to compell others to custome spes or debts in
yeir lawfull sum of debt or account, were distray'd and困hammed, and to
punish them out of ye offenders hands by open force and armes, and bein
nowe newly informed yet divers of them to intend to protest against us in
yeir said unlawfull and rebellious acts, did prowl and conspire wth them
Subiquit^t encouraged and byr judicis against ye inhabitan's of ye colony.

Have thought it fitt that G. Coborne should sail in yhe to ye said C. of Kent
and take along wth him a sufficient number of soldiers well arm'd, and yhe
by martiall law. (if it shall be necessary) reduce ye inhabitan's of ye said
C. to yeire due submission to yo' Lord Propriett, and to Dealt (if need be)
correst miscreants and rebellious offenders who shall not (after proclamation made)
submit themselves to a due course of justice. And for ye better assistance herein
it was thought fitt and so ordred that Captain Thomas Cromwell Esq^r and
such other Comstle of ye Province should go along wth G. Coborne, and be aiding
and assisting to him to ye attenct of ye power for ye command of ye forces
according to his directions as he shall receive from G. Coborne, During his
expedition.

you that you keepe and attayn to our v. p. all resell trading wth ye Indians in any part
of our Province, or yhe greate part thereof, and yhe same part of yhe province to trade wth any
Indian out of our province; and all such things as may be wanted for their use
or about any such place; as also all such other commodities wanted for and
draught of any Indians as aforesaid, wthout yheire lioneure of us or I L. Calvert
your late lord^r tunc^r being, and yhe resell or commodities to be paid to deliver to I
Calvert for our v. p. Given at Boston 15. 2. 1637.
