Lieutenant Governour of the Province of Maryland, send greeting in the Lord God
everlasting witness that the general Assembly began on the 20th day of
January last past, and by several adjournments continued until the 26th day
of the instant month of February, was adjourned until the 26th day of the instant
month; now desiring that it may be made an expedition in order unto the
Isle of Kent, and doubting lest some accident might hinder my returne to
the same before the said day, whereby the said Assembly would of itselfe be dissolved
for want of power to assemble; know ye therefore that in case of my
absence I have authorized and deputed, & doe hereby appoint authorize and
depute my John Leuger Secretary in my name and place to hold and con-
vene the said Assembly at the day appointed, and to give voice for me to
all and only such things as he shall think fitt, also to adjourn or dissolve the
said Assembly as he shall see cause, and to doo and performe all things
belonging to the said Assembly as much as in him and his power shall be
if my selfe might doe it if I were personally present
