James Clopton in answer complauntly agt. Anthony Cotton of St. Marcell  
quintred planter, for that whereas ye said Anthony Cotton did in ye beginning  
of August last entreat ye said James Clopton into ye prison, and did rebuand  
and agree to pay unto him one hundred shilings worth of good merchantable  
tobacco by ye month for stony months yet he should have him; that ye said James  
Clopton did pay ye said Anthony Cotton for two months commencing from ye time  
aforesaid; & further yet whereas ye said James Clopton did in September last  
sell unto ye said Anthony Cotton 4 casks of Corham full of fairly weight of  
tobacco to be paid upon demand; nevertheless ye said Anthony Cotton not regarding  
ye said rebuand and bargain, but intending fraudulently to receive ye said James  
Clopton, ye said ~~James Clopton~~ hundred pound of tobacco unto ye said James  
Clopton yet not yet paid, but yet refused and did not refuse to pay ye said  
alloye ye said James Clopton demanded by ye said James Clopton. And for  
ye said James Clopton to be paid.
