Certains Lord Proprietary & Wallonian people to whom Esq: John Doe late owner of said  
warehouse William Bliffard late of Esq: of Kent planter, being to take in his place of office  
& by his memory make his Capt: & will and testament nowe made in his present mindes and  
borene following, that it to saye being after by Henry Crawley of Esq: and planter, and  
the same male & female in all his personal estate, what suffice he did intend to take in  
his place, and whence wch: could give it in safe Custome to him by deale; so said  
William Bliffard auerstated in these words, wch: could gabe it but you, (meaning the fact Henry  
Crawley) and being against demande wch: he wrode in good remembrance of wch: he  
said, he auerstated againe, wch: I graffe said, and all ych: alfo gabs of gib: to you; remaining  
to said Henry Crawley, as is Described by the oyle of the said Henry Crawley taken before  
the said Henry Crawley taken before the Secretary of the Province, and by the other all oyle  
of Richard Puritant, and myloune Prior of the same planter taken before the said  
planter by a Lieutenant generall of the Province. Know ye yorfor yorselfe doe  
grovly approued we said Capt: and replacement of the said William Bliffard & doe  
comittments aditt & appoint to said Henry Crawley to be Capt: & planter of the said Capt: & planter  
and replacement of the said William Bliffard, & to doe & execute all Engys wch: unto an equall  
affection & as a Plesure of common right. Given at St: maries.

memorandum that Henry Crawley acknowledge himselfe to owe unto the Lord Proprietary  
fiftey and wiight of fiftie tobaccoe to be paid unto the said Lord Proprietary or his  
or assigns, on the 10<sup>th</sup> of November next in case the said Henry Crawley shall not  
make and deliver into the Court at St: maries a true and perfect Inventory of  
all the estate goods chattels & debts wch: belongeth unto the Province unto William  
Bliffard late of Esq: of Kent planter deceased; and in case the said Henry  
Crawley shall not make and deliver into the said Court a true account of the debts  
of the said estate wch: he shall & shalbe demanded by the Secretary of the  
Province. And unto his payment (except before excepted) the said Henry Crawley  
shall bind himselfe to his executors exequitatis and administratrix.

Memorandum of William Edwin planter acknowledging himselfe to owe unto  
the Lord Proprietary one ych: and wiight of unpayable tobaccoe to be  
paid upon demand, in case the said William Edwin shall have married  
himselfe to any other woman other than myselfe before; or in case  
there is any consanguinity affinity or other lawfull impediment to his  
hedges of the said William Edwin wch: he shalbe not be married to the said woman  
without me.
