Cerillus Lord Proprietor &c. to all christian people to whom this shall come greeting  
whereas William Bliffard late of the shire of Kent planter; being in the body and of your  
self & memory, made his last will and testament mentioning in his last will and  
testament following, that he to pay being asked by Henry Crawley of the shire of Kent planter, and  
the said Henry Crawley in all his small estate, what course he did intend to take in  
the said estate, and how he would give it in case God should call him to death; the said  
Henry Crawley answered in the words, you should give it but you; (meaning the said Henry  
Crawley) and being asked demanded whether he were in good remembrance of what he  
said, he answered againe, yes I praise God, and all that I got of you to you; meaning  
the said Henry Crawley; as is devised by the said Henry Crawley taken before  
the said Henry Crawley taken before the Secretary of the Province, and by the said all oaths  
of Richard Parliament, and also the said Henry Crawley taken before the said  
Governor of the Province of the said Province. Know ye therefore that we do  
yourly approve the said last will and testament of the said William Bliffard & do  
with us admit & appoint the said Henry Crawley to be executor of the said last will  
and testament of the said William Bliffard & to do & receive all things which unto and against  
the said Henry Crawley do belong of common right. Given at St. marie.

five hundred and weight of good tobacco to be paid unto the said Lord Proprietor or his  
or assigns, on the 10th of November next in case the said Henry Crawley shall not  
make and deliver into the Court at St. marie, a true and perfect Inventory of  
all the estate goods, chattels & debts which he should within the Province unto William  
Bliffard late of the shire of Kent planter deceased; and in case the said Henry  
Crawley shall not make and deliver into the said Court a true account of the dispo-  
sing of the said estate upon the said Henry Crawley demanded by the Secretary of the  
Province. And unto the payment (except before expressed) the said Henry Crawley  
doe bind himselfe by oaths, exequels and aduocates.

Memorandum that William Edwin planter acknowledgeth himselfe to owe unto
