and testament bearing date the 17th day of December 1628
Cornwall Esq. and one of the Council of the Province, for and in satisfaction of a debt

Esq. assigne the said Thomas Cornwall was; and in the said bill of sale
did bind himself and his heirs in 1000. nomine prode to make good the said bill
of sale; now forasmuch as the said Thomas Cornwall is deceased without

the Court the 17th day ordered that the said Thomas Cornwall shall have day to answer the said bill of
the said Thomas Cornwall until the fourth day of August next, 1631, in the presence
of the Lord and one or more and four or more, until the time, or until the said Thomas Cornwall
and all appearing to the said Thomas Cornwall shall hold and arrange the said
land (the widow's rights only excepted) and all the goods upon the said
