be presented to the Court. and said the admiracon com-
mitted to him.

The said day before me the said Thomas Lybden acknowledged
himself to owe unto the Lord Proprietarie one hundred and
threescore, in case he shall not make a true and just Subentary
of the goods & chattels of James Lizyrd within the Province at
the time of the death, & shall not truly performe the oyle points
committed to him by the Commission of admiracon, according to
the oyle made in that behalf.
