greeting. whereas only hath been made unto of the said Michael Lunt's grant of  
the grounds granted, being demanded upon the debt paid, who intended to dispose  
of goods unto if any remainder should be after the debt paid, made answer in  
his words, who would give it to but to Mr. Hemmick, who best disposed it  
& of which it is little for you in regard of the care & charge of me in my  
Brother's, or to your purpose; Know ye therefore that we have approved, & hereby  
do approve & admit the said disposition for the last will and testament of  
the said Michael Lunt; & the said Culbert Hemmick, for the execution. Carrying  
you by virtue of the said will & testament in his behalf the Substantary before  
the first of February; & an Arraignment upon the said. Given the 4th January

in satisfaction not performed the conditions required of him for the making
