 we do hereby relying upon your faithful and Diligent, commit unto you the
 Admiration of all your goods, rights & debts we were willing we should
 late of your said ^{Virginia} ^{Company} described in letters as it appeared, with in 1639
 previous; ^{at} ^{the} ^{time} ^{of} ^{the} ^{deal} ^{ing} ^{with} ^{you} ^{by} ^{virtue} ^{of} ^{your} ^{own} ^{made} ^{into} ^{an} ^{act} ⁱⁿ ^{your} ^{legal} ^{power}
 that you faithfully make a true and perfect Inventory, in your presence and by
 the direction of two good and discreet neighbors, to be made of all the said
 goods, chattels, rights, and debts; and fully appraised to their value in your presence
 of the said two neighbors; and the said Inventory & appraisement to deliver unto
 the Secretary before the first of May next, and that you will and lawfully give
 all and only the just & true debts of the said ^{Virginia} ^{Company} as you are bound by
 law required. And that you make and deliver unto the said Secretary a true
 and faithful Account of your said Admiration, before the first day of June next,
 or sooner if you shall be so demanded by the said Secretary. Given at St. Michaels
 the twentieth day of January: anno 1639. ^{Attest} ^{the} ^{Hand} ^{of} ^{John} ^{Cauley}

The said John Caulger made oath to the purpose as it above mentioned,
 and further acknowledged himself to owe unto the Lord Proprietaries one hundred
 pounds of tobacco in case the same were not performed by such day.
