right debts goods & chattels in the presence & by the direction of the said
two neighbours & deliberators. And that you be diligent to the said
Comander at such point before the end of the month of August, unless
larger time be given you by the said Comander. And that you will
make a true & faithful account of the said administration, when you
shall be required demanded by us or our Judge for causes & reasons.
Given at St. Maries the 2^d August 1642 witness our hand &c.
