

and any writs... knowledge of it.

And in... defendant it not an inhabitant of the Province or it... out of it; the Judge shall give reasonable time for the answer...

And any parties... of the Province for debt or malice... delivered in execution to the creditors... within the Province; giving every right to succeed.

7. An Act for the better ordering of the proceedings in Courts.

The Judge in Commission of the Peace... & sufficient power for the administration of justice... to all persons in all causes within cognizance of the Court...

8. An Act ordering some things touching the trial & judging of causes.

The Judge may administer an oath to either party in any civil cause for the better investigation of the truth, and upon any oath refused, may proceed against him...

The defendant in any cause civil or criminal, may put him self for trial, upon the Judge, or Court, or upon the country, or may waive the Law in cases allowable by the Law of England...

The Sheriff in warning of Jurors shall observe a certain course & order of law among all the Sheriffs of the County... and the writ for warning any Jury shall not be returnable until fifteen days before the trial...

And any... necessary & sufficient, according to the case... 15th year of the King's Majesty.
