

QD your Sover eye and other Districcys of yor Province or any part thereof again
yor assault or invasion of yor Indivis or other end withall require it, it shall be cause
for yor Lord proprieator or yor Lieutenant Generall, to proesse or take any resellle, inde
prolifions, armes ammunition or other thinges warlike for defensys at yor next shal
valys of yor country at yor tyme, and yor proprieator give yor selfe to charge upon yor in
habitants of yor Province in þis maner & accordynge to þis proportion as yor said
Lieutent. Generall will yor advice & assent of yor Council or yor major part of
yem yor present in yor County shall yor selfe fitt.

Provided legg pay or arrengt amont not in one yarde to abode fourty shill
weight of tobacco in S. Marin County, nor in Kent to abode two shill and weight
of tobacco.

And if any person grafted to you or you are subligent for want or exordination
by authority of any Law or Proclamation, & doth or do thy corporal punishment in that form
so as to disable him to follow his labour or vocation, he shall stand and be fit
wife & children (if he have any and not otherwise maintainable) shall and intend
till he be able to work, at the charge of the Province or County, in that manner &
according to his valles & proportions as by Court of all assesse.

• And if any inhabitant be constrained (by publick order) to forsake his
or goods for the affiting of others or for common safety, whether his goods or god-
sowne to soile or garnet, his person or carret or soile, upon proofe of damage
all galls of soile or losses recovered by a publick contribution of the neighbour-
County, where he hath his appayll, in summe mende & according to his proportion
as shall be assed by ye Court. It is done to answer for lands & houses from ye

Sheriff's Patent.

Be it known to all men &c. That we the Lord & Proprietary of Maryland do by these presents know & say that under
reverence & speciall trust in the faithfulness & diligence of Edward Parker, do hereby
confire & appoint him to be our said Sheriff of the County of St. Marys. To be
& hold the said Office unto him by said Edward Parker, until the first of March
1643. And we do hereby require & command all persons whatsoever within the said County
for ye time being, to be aiding & assisting to him in the performance of his said office
& to acknowledge him to be & respect him in his quality of Sheriff, as you will answer
the contrary at your peril. And we do further authorize him to appoint his Coffer
or Under Sheriff in above named within the said County at his pleasure. Given at St.
Marys the fifteenth Day of September 1642. Wm. Somers & I. de la Brogny
Leonard Calvert Esq: &c.

on the 15th day of September 15th 1608 following he was admitted to Edward
Barker; [sic] you shall swear what well & truly you will, before the Lord, prop-
erty of his [sic] [sic] office of Sheriff, & doe his Lord's profit in all things
that belongeth to you to doe by way of your office as far forth as you may; you shall
truly & fairly treat all people of your jurisdiction, & doe right & justice to poor
as to rich, in all that belongeth to your office; you shall truly returne and truly
pay all writs & warrants lawfully directed to you, to your master; and in all
your writings you shall & fairly discharge the office of Sheriff committed unto you, to
your shame & powder. I. e. god save you God.]
