

As to the 1st interrogatory proposed

1. Did you at any time signify your unwillingness, or say designed or say against the service to Mr. Giles Brent or to others in words importing that you were at no time would be the sending of the powder of Kent and if anything of it, or in what words you signified your unwillingness, or in what manner gave you guard or say signify unwillingness, or you may say you signified your unwillingness, or you may say you were unwilling in some place, or that you were unwilling, or you may say you were unwilling as was above expressed.

2. Did you or your self or gave you guard any day and you may say as you remember, or complain to the said Giles Brent or to others in any manner relate it to him, in words to the effect, that if the said Giles Brent should take our powder, many of us would be left wholly destitute, and almost no one sufficiently furnished with ammunition, or what do you know of the powder of ammunition to the effect or gave guard or say relate.

3. Did you or your self or gave you guard any day, and you may say as you remember, that upon the return of the expedition the enemy was to be expected to go by night after you to Kent, you should being you distinguished of ammunition or words to the effect, that you were to be expected to fire & destruction of your tobacco, coffee of eggs and cattle killing of men in the woods, that you could not be able to go about your business or what of the effect or to the effect gave you said or guard spoken, and by you may say as you remember.

4. Were you pressed for that voyage and did you say or did you give any day that was pressed for that your or your going at that time would be the loss of many of your people except in respect you were not yet sent, or to the effect, you may say that you did so as you think, and in you may say of the pressed men, that was the true state of both of your knowledge.

5. Did you say if that voyage were made you must or would do about the Island or words to that purpose, did you give any day say your words, and you may say as you said to you think.

6. Did you if you were pressed for that voyage or if any of your goods was pressed, or send me pound of powder and five pound of shot to Kent according to the way for our men, or did you not complain that you did not so much or send not so much as you think from the necessary defence, or did you give any day say, and you may say as you think were you.

7. Did you say any of the before reported things if you gave said any of them by information from the said Giles Brent, or because you had knowledge or opinion of the same in your own understanding.

Parties to be examined whether they or some of them were not your own allies, or to Mr. Brent or say as gave guard or say make sign or to one another.
