

Commission of inquiry  
upon m. Brent.

Whereas we do our truly william Brantwaite & Robt. Vaughan, the respective we are  
informed that Giles Brent gent late Comdr of the said place, & wife. Judge in civil  
matters, gave during the holding the said place of indurance, upon a plaintiff demanded  
indigent or equitation agst. a defendant. refused to do the plaintiff right to wit, &  
the said Giles Brent gave overlooked the account book & if he find any defect  
engaged to give the said Giles Brent upon the said defendant. gave made over of  
to give the said Giles Brent for the recovery or, possibly, possibly the plaintiff  
became defrauded or in danger to be defrauded of the recovery, to the great delay of  
justice, oppression of the inhabitants, & fraud of our government in Virginia & other  
parts.

And willing that the justice of the Court should be found free of such fraud  
and that the said Giles Brent be either cleared in the same, if he be innocent  
be false (as we suspect & hope it is) or if it be true, punished to the example of  
others, & vindication of our honor in the said place. Do hereby authorize you to  
will & require you privately to inquire & inform your self whether there be  
publique fame or no within the said place, Virginia, or other parts, of the  
injury by the said Giles Brent, & if by any inquiry, or otherwise without it of  
your own knowledge you be satisfied that there is such publique fame; you to call  
you all the persons, as you think you may see cause to examine by the  
corporate oath, upon all such interrogatories, as you shall think fit & requisite to  
give us true & certain knowledge whether any such injury or oppression have been  
committed by the said Giles Brent, & at what time or times, & to what persons  
in what parts, & to what effect & importance, & in what other manner, nature, or  
manner, as you shall think pertinent to the said inquiry. And the examinations to  
taken signed with the Decretment & sent to transmit to us or our Lieut. General  
without delay, and before the first of December next at the furthest. Given at  
Marye the 21 October 1642. witness our hand & seal.
