Cecilus &c. To all whom these presents shall come, we, Thomas Gerard and James Neale of St. Clements church
and that, or to either of you, greeting, whereas upon the complaints formerly made
to us of divers injuries committed upon the estate by the Indians of the parts, we
have demanded satisfaction of some of the great men of the town, and also we
obtained any as yet, and we have also admitted you to commit no more like
at the price of your liberty that would commit it, willing you to publish your
admonition to the several Indians of the town, since we have heard of the
divers injuries and worst injuries that have been done (as you complain) daily com-
mitted upon the same & estate. Not respecting special confidence in the several
managing thereof, do hereby warrant & authorize you at any time or times as
you shall meet with any Indians killing the estate, or otherwise trespassing upon
you in any your lands, goods by grain from us, to demand of you satisfaction
for the injuries received from you or any of your nation, and in default of
such satisfaction, to pillage you of what you may within your said lands, and
to use any other force to restrain you & put you off your lands as you shall
think fit to deterre you from attempting the like again. And if any of your
shall resist or proffer any violence against you in the execution thereof, to the dan-
gering of any persons of the place or any of your company assisting you herein
you to use any further force or violence as you shall think fit for the suppressing
of the force & to our satisfaction, you are authorized to use killing any of your
