Cards, Land &c to our trusty & dear Comr. of His Excellency. Whereas by  
me & you your honour command & require in martial affairs, & as made  
of one of you, and doth hereby appoint and authorize you to take and use all  
meat & sufficient stores for equipping and maintaining of soldiers within  
sight of no man; and for you making with you an expedition upon any place declared  
enemys of His Majestie, or any place aiding or countenancing, and doing, appointing,  
providing, managing & commanding you said expedition, & all persons belonging  
thereto belonging, and all power & authority to take, use & keep right, for in  
and during your said expedition, as amply & fully to all effects & circumstances, as  
any Captain General of an army may take, use, or exercise by law of  
war. Given at St. Maries the 23<sup>rd</sup> January 1642. witness to & dated by

whereas of undoubted of divers idolatries and heres abroad in ye colony longing ye  
Indians, and your expectation of a great charge & hindrance to your forces either in reducing  
a nearey upon you, or in hazard against you, to ye disannihilation of ye people; and  
forgetting your whole Diligence & care in proceeding in your labours for ye  
repose, for remeide thereof and to assure you of what consideration it had afforid  
parties & cause, & thought fit to publike & declare unto you all possible Diligence  
it shall be, to forth & furnishing ye country with ammunition, and that as soon as  
conveniently may be) you shall an expedition, & force against ye Indian enemies  
of His Majestie, at ye charge of His L. T. (paying the p[er]sones, & ye soldiers to  
make up expedition wth all, for wch & p[er]sones only ye country shall pay) and that  
Capt. Cornwallis Esq: is appointed & by you undertaken to you as General of ye  
expedition, to whom for each gaben all purrash, ye p[er]sones & audience during  
ye said expedition, to be by him dict[ed], & for ye ensuragement of volunteers, yet  
will not impeble, only to be at your owne charge, and for ye reward of it, nothing  
as ye shall find you to deserve. And further for ye greater ensuragement and  
relief of ye, & at all wch upon ye p[er]sones & will wth all reasonable p[ro]portion that may  
be made to ye said expedition p[er]sones to make, and (by R. D. & C. & C.) performed that it shall  
be ye considerable hindrance to any ones repose: and yet ye debt, & loss & exp[ense] & not  
ability will not reach to ye p[er]sones of ye reprobate, without greevous p[er]secution  
and disabling them for yeire necessities p[er]petuate for ye future, & will wthout  
wth your Credit if you be inabilitie of His Majestie to forbear until ye next year
