Let it be enquired for the King's Bench if Richard Knight mariner, who was
sent of Jamaica in the 17th year of the said King's Majesty, on the main for falling
to the petition, aboard the ship (called the Reformation) did up & utter the words
next [The King is no King, nor will I acknowledge him for my King longer
than he shall be the King of the people of Parliament.] maliciously & traitorously
as an outrage of the Lord's King, & opposing to the authority of the Lord's King
contrary to the allegiance, & the oath of the Governor: to the King: it is ordered & directed
the Governor of the said Province: &c.

Copy of the petition of the said Attorney General against John Hamilton of London

That whereas on the 10th day of January last the said King's Bench, belonging to the
King's Bench, was by the said King's Bench arrested & put into the custody of the said John Hamilton
until the said King's Bench should order himself of certain matters of the said King's Bench
charged against him, in the express order & command of the said King's Bench to the said John Hamilton, not
to permit the said King's Bench to come aboard in any vessel or upon any other vessel whatsoever
the said King's Bench taken to the said King's Bench: whereupon the said John Hamilton the said King's Bench
did quietly permit & suffer to come aboard, against the said King's Bench: & made
refusal of the said King's Bench, & by the said King's Bench & James the said King's Bench appointed to be
aiding to him, not encouraging & aiding to the said King's Bench: to the said King's Bench of
the said King's Bench; contrary to the said King's Bench, & to the great contempt of the said King's Bench
and of the said King's Bench, & to the great contempt & indignation, & voluntary

the said Edward Parker suffered the said Knight to go at large, afore
& without any lawful discharge, & to the great contempt & indignation, & voluntary
deliberation of the said King's Bench in manner aforesaid, the said Attorney General in the said
Edward Parker: &c.
