G. & others above named, conspired & joined together to release the said R. G. & to said ship out of the said custody, and did release & set him at liberty, & otherwise abet the said guard, riotously & disorderly & contrary to your allegiance to the King, & the law of the land, & the law of the Lord's authority, & dignity.
