7. That you will give best aid and labor to discharge your bargain in the way made by your
 for Mr. Copley's goods at St. Mark's, by letting your goods go to Mr. Gilmett's hand against
 the reasonable consideration allowed you for Mr. Gilmett's time of bringing in it.
 Mr. Gilmett will not be contented unless you give to Mr. Gilmett till mid June.
 Mr. Gilmett's name is in the list of reasonable men as my said Council or
 any two of you (except your said Mr. Gilmett to be one) shall think fit; and that Mr.
 Gilmett and his family shall not be provided & discharged out of my port and
 houses at West St. Mark's without any probable provision to be made for them, or out of
 bond or profits belonging to me here (but in the case of Mr. Gilmett I should be very glad that my
 said Council should assist for me, and I would willingly allow any reasonable sum
 to be paid out of my estate here to Mr. Copley for his said goods for some time, but
 not to be charged to you any more for it) you shall desire my said Council
 in your case to take care that bond or profits should not be provided for
 Mr. Gilmett & Mr. Copley's residence & that you shall see to it that Mr. Gilmett
 also mentioned will be of accommodation for you & that you shall see to it that
 and I would give you to contribute to his business (if possibly you can) against Mr. Gilmett
 and Mr. Copley may be all means be continued in your provision till your time.
 you shall doubt not (by the grace of God) to be able to provide better for you than
 by reason of the extremity of the present troubles in England I could do for you.
 Mr. Gilmett's will not be a little gratified till you, and that article of the
