Decree in the L. name to prohibit all Indian to inhabit lands of this  
Province to land, fish, etc, or border any arms or ammunition w<sup>t</sup> he unto  
any Indians w<sup>t</sup> in this Province might have first had from the Governor of this  
Province for so long time, and to authorize any inhabitant of this Province  
w<sup>t</sup> all meet w<sup>t</sup> any Indian w<sup>t</sup> in this Province (w<sup>t</sup> out of his Province);  
giving w<sup>t</sup> him any ammunition to take away from him, and deliver him  
unto the Governor for so long time: and likewise to prohibit the almighty God  
inhabitants of this Province to entertain or receive into their houses (w<sup>t</sup> out  
of aforesaid Province) any Indians whatsoever as they will answerably contrary  
to their will. Given at West St. Marks ye 13. of November 1644.
