In the name of god Amen We: I Rob<sup>t</sup>. Tutty of New-Towne doe with my life will & Testament in manner following. Viz I bequeath my land with the hands of my Executors, hoping to be saved by his death & pardon, my body to the world to be decently buried. And of the worldly estate, which god hath made one steward of in this world, I doe give & bequeath in this manner.

Item. All the Tob. w<sup>ch</sup> M<sup>r</sup>. Tompson overtook mee, w<sup>ch</sup> is about 1200<sup>l</sup> I doe give unto him.

Item. One Cow, & steer, & yearling calves, I desire shall be equally divided betwixt the heirs of the said M<sup>r</sup>. Tompson, & Joseph Adell.

Item. One yearling heifer (w<sup>ch</sup> I bought of James Johnson) I doe give to M<sup>r</sup>. Tompson's child.

Item. My bed I give to M<sup>r</sup>. Tompson.

Item. My boys to be divided betwixt M<sup>r</sup>. Tompson, & Joseph as afore<sup>s</sup> only one young sow to be given to Phillip Brother.

Item. The Tob. w<sup>ch</sup> Joseph Adell overtook mee, w<sup>ch</sup> is about 800<sup>l</sup> I doe bequeath unto him. Only my will is to be satisfied out of it, what I owe to Edward Ingham in Virginia, w<sup>ch</sup> is under a loghead, & w<sup>ch</sup> I know not.

Item. My debts I desire should be paid, w<sup>ch</sup> I owe viz to Walter Beane 100<sup>l</sup> & to Ralph Beane of like quantity or thereabouts, & other debts to be paid betwixt both my Executors.

Item. One old fute of clothes I doe give to Matthias Bariat.

Item. The Crop of mine in the grounds my Executors to dispose of.
