Humbly sheweth: That yo petitioners were hired by Capt Giles Brent Esq: for the
Gilmot in Anno Dom: 1643: and yo petitioners wanted to have for their hire one
cow and half a year, and an ox, for yo petitioners would not receive, but one cow
and half a year, humbly desireth yo wor^{ship} to be pleased to take it into yo
consideration whereby they may by now satisfie, as the cattle is by yo in exchange
would have byn mine: And yo petitioners shall ever pray:

Giles Brent Esq in the cause of Nicholas Letin & James Lynny, then Comys
for the Co: Proprietor private & statid (being appointed by him so to provide for Mr
Gilmot) contract wth ~~the said Nicholas~~ for his service to Mr Gilmot, that he should
have certain cattle, and toery thinketh this bargain to have by a god as it is
expressed in the petition: and the troubles ensuing in this Country knoweth nothing of
payment made

The deposition of J^r Thomas Bradnor aged fower to yeres
or thereabouts, taken 10th of Septemb^r 1647:

This deponent affirmeth upon oath: That Mr Nathaniell Pope, when he was sent a
deputy from the Governour of Maryland, did as much as he could to animate the people to
abandon the land, and that if they would come and live at Aqueducts, he should not
question but in short tyme, to get strength enough, to get the Country a gain, and
that they might injure them selves, that the tobacco w^{ch} he demandeth of them at that
tyme, he would assuredly have: for he was a coming by as soon as they returned
wth a great company of Cavaliers: And further this deponent knoweth not:

hadge promised, unto us, yet they should find, that there would nothing be performed
by him, but to be in great suspition, and if they did not stand true hearted and true
together, they would be betrayed: And further this deponent sayeth not:
