 added if what soe<sup>er</sup> was his formerly in Mary-land, say he did confirme  
 unto him of Mr. Thorneborough. & further he sayd not.

 Mr. Jarbo deposed sayd of being att Keoran Mr. Calvert sent this Dept  
 to Mr. Thorneborough, to deppie him to meete him att York, & speake w<sup>th</sup>  
 him, & bid this Dept. tell of Mr. Thorneborough if he should not know  
 any thing, what had passed in former times. And if he plantain (meaning Mr.  
 meales plantation as this Dept. beleueh) or any thing else (if was formerly  
 his (to wit Mr. Thorneborough) in Mary-land he would confirme, it unto him.  
 & upon this Mr. Thorneborough came up w<sup>th</sup> Mr. Calvert & further  
 meeting him the 1<sup>st</sup> Mr. Calvert att York, he of Mr. Calvert looked the  
 1<sup>st</sup> Mr. Thorneborough by the hand bidding him wellcome, & in this Dept. he  
 sayd forgive him & speake of former words of quest, or such like to him  
 & further he sayd not.

The eighteenth day of October 1647.

In the name of god Amen. I Frances Case of the County of Kent, in the province  
 of Mary-land in the parts of America gentleswoman, being of lawfull memory  
 hence, thanks be to god therfore doe make & ordaine this my last will and  
 Testament in the manner & forme following.

First I bequeath my soules in the hands of Ihesus Christ my Redeemer from whom  
 I received hope through the merits & graces of his passion to obtaine  
 mission of my sins, & redemption of my soules at the day of my birth.  
 As for my Body I bequeath it to the earth from whence it was taken, &  
 receive decent & Christian Burialle according to the direction of my bequeath

As for my worldly estate (my debts & funerall charges being fully & lawfully  
 discharged in the first place) I doe make Cap<sup>t</sup>. Rob<sup>t</sup>. Vaughan now being  
 absent from the Island my lawfull executour for the children. If on any  
 he be not well, or any way be befallen him, I make Harry Gray  
 the eldest for my children hole & sole. This is my last will & Testament  
 witness my hand
